Uninvited visiting children should be ejected (maybe this regulation should be brought into force if a polite request does not do the trick!)

Parents are asked to keep their children reasonably quiet and to operate a curfew until 10 am at weekends (this latter regulation is very strongly valued by many residents).

Regarding ball games: children should be discouraged from using hard balls, playing while the grass is wet, using the lights as goalposts, or playing after 9 pm.

FINANCIAL

Interest will be charged on subscriptions paid late.

Residents are repeatedly asked to pay subscriptions by bankers' order.

The Society's cheques are to be signed by two of its officers (directors).

Expenditure over £500 requires notice being given in writing to all residents giving them 2 weeks to object (if more than 2 residents object a general meeting to be called). Expenditure over £1000 requires the sanction of a meeting.

GENERAL

Ice cream vans should not call more than once a day.

Residents are reminded how noise travels, especially at night.

REGULATIONS

Corner Green Residents' Society Limited was incorporated on St George's Day 1959. One of its objects is 'to make regulations for the use by the owners and occupiers of the said houses ... of the commonest parts of the Green'.

The following regulations have been agreed over the intervening years at Director' and Annual General meetings. While some of the following cannot really be regarded as regulations, but rather as pleas for neighbourly conduct, and others were obviously in answer to some particular nuisance being experienced at the time, it is important that all residents are aware of them.

This list was collated by our last Chairperson, Roger Chater, and he states that he has excluded decisions that were subsequently revoked and those that are obviously no longer relevant.

These regulations do not include the items which appear as covenants in the leases.

CARS:

Residents have been asked to use the car parks only for parking and not to park on pavements or grass, to park in line and not behind nos 19-23. The area behind no 18 belongs to Corner Green and not Corner Keep.

Residents have been requested not to park so as to obstruct the garages, rot to leave garage doors open.

GARDENING

Gardening should not be done by residents in person (this must mean to the common areas!), who should take care to avoid getting stone on the lawn.

The dump is to be used for biodegradable garden rubbish only.

Dogs should not be allowed on the Green.

CHILDREN

Parents are asked to keep children under control. They should be dissuaded from riding bicycles (as opposed to tricycles) on the green and from approaching or climbing on parked cars.

All toys should be cleared away before dusk for safety's sake (one could also add that many toys have been stolen).

The dangers of children removing light bulbs, and of their climbing up small trees, has been pointed out.
