1) Minutes of previous AGM

The minutes of the 2012 AGM were agreed.

2) Chairman's Report

Mark Helm presented his verbal report.

3) Treasurer's Report and Accounts

David Howes noted that he had circulated his written report ahead of the meeting. On the basis of his financial projections he recommended no change in the service charge this year, but anticipated a need to raise the monthly charge to £130 at the 2014 AGM.

The accounts including the agreed sum for the painting contract were accepted.

4) Work Report

Mac Cochrane presented his Works Report, previously circulated.

5) Gardening Committee

8) A.O.B.

Juliet raised the matter of the dump. The meeting was advised that this posed a significant cost for CGRS and it is not therefore possible for it to be reinstated.

There was discussion of the useful survey re door colours. An alternate possibility to another colour would be for the doors to be restored to their original varnished wood and Graeme was asked if he could give consideration as to whether this was a possibility for this current painting contract given that some houses had less painting required than was contracted for. However it was acknowledged that any change may not be possible for this painting cycle.
