1.	CGRS Ltd Secretary Role

3.	Plane Tree

4. Children's Play

Directors agreed to remind all residents of the longstanding rules on children's play incorporated in the Information for Residents:

Adults are asked to supervise any children playing in the common areas. Only children who are residents or who are visiting residents may use the Green.

Parents are asked to ensure that their children do not make too much noise. Particularly they are asked to operate a "curfew" until 10am on Sundays. (This practise has been observed for many years and is greatly valued by residents.)

Residents are asked to clear all toys from the common areas before dusk and in particular to ensure that objects are not left on paths.

Bikes, skateboards, scooters and skates should not be ridden on the grass.

Participants in all games played on the Green are asked to respect other residents, their property and the environment.

Football – with light balls is allowed with the following restrictions:

- Football should not be played when the ground is wet or on any area under repair.
- Play should be conducted in such a way that avoids the risk of damage to property plants and amenities.
- The number of players should be restricted to ensure that the majority of players are residents.
- Play should be ended before 9pm.
- The wishes of others using the Green should be observed.
